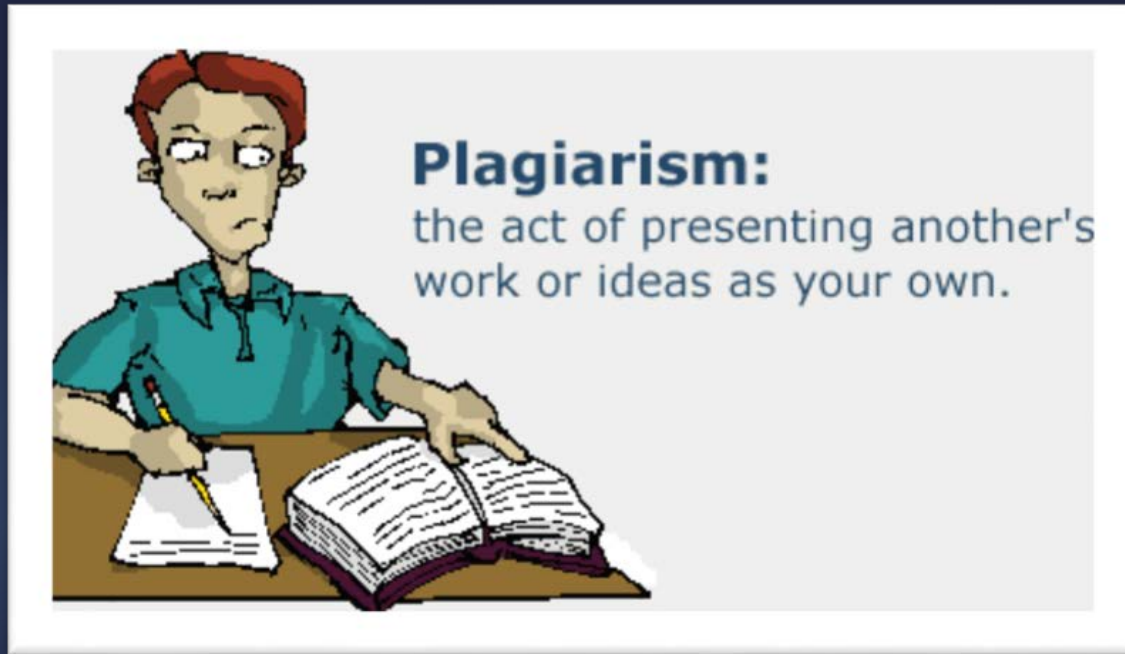




PLAGIARISM is wrong

AVOID COPYING, AND BEING COPIED!

THE IMPACT OF TECHNOLOGY



- ▶ **Easier to research a topic**
- ▶ **Easier to copy & paste**
- ▶ **Easier to plagiarize, whether intentional or unintentional**

MULTI-USER COMPUTERS

- ▶ **VARIOUS CLASSES USE COURSE SOFTWARE LIKE MYITLAB**
 - ▶ **FILES ARE DOWNLOADED**
 - ▶ **YOU MAY USE THE SAME COMPUTER, AS ANOTHER STUDENT, FOR THE SAME COURSE**
- ▶ **YOU MAY ACCIDENTALLY SUBMIT THE WORK DONE BY SOMEONE ELSE**
- ▶ **HOW DO YOU AVOID THIS?**

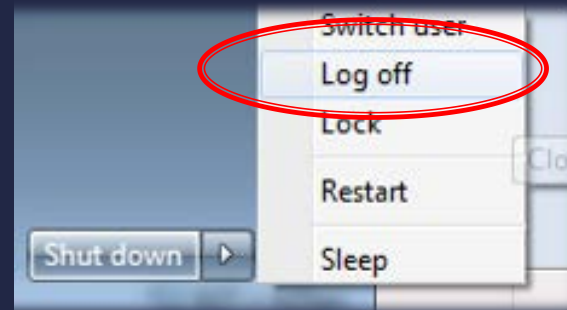


WHEN YOU START WORKING

- 1. If the computer is logged in, log it off.**
- 2. The computer will restart.**
- 3. Campus computers have software that “resets” the computer upon each log off.**

WHEN YOU ARE FINISHED

1. Delete any saved file from the computer.
2. Empty the Recycle Bin (waste basket).
3. To complete the “house cleaning” log off the computer, if located on the SWOSU campus.




WHEN USING COURSE SOFTWARE

- 1. Extract and download files correctly so you know where they are saved.**
- 2. Make sure the files you are using are the ones you downloaded.**
- 3. When submitting, make sure you are uploading your own file. In MyITLab, it should start with your name.**

MyITLab's Role

- ▶ MyITLab has a built in plagiarism checker. A mark is placed in the gradebook, that only the instructor can see, notifying the instructor that a “potential integrity violation” has occurred. You must download and complete your own files.
- ▶ The feature checks a file two different ways:
- ▶ Ownership – In this picture, Jane Doe submitted the file
- ▶ Document & Content – The document and content editing belong to Jack Doe
